

Board Meeting Highlights

The Board of Directors met Friday, September 21, 2018 at Tallwood. OLLI President Bill Taylor welcomed everyone back for the fall term and noted the wide selection of courses covering diverse topics being offered for this term. He expressed appreciation to all the volunteers that help make OLLI successful, and also stressed that members should take advantage of the wonderful courses and programs offered by our Reston and Loudoun campuses. He acknowledged Executive Director Jennifer Disano's efforts in arranging our collaborative effort with AARP on September 8th by hosting their "Boomer Academy" at Tallwood.

The Strategic Planning Committee is beginning to work on a survey to the membership to get their views on the draft strategic goals we've developed.

Jennifer Disano reported that as of September 14, 2018, total membership is 1,160 (annual membership is 1,112 and term membership is 48). She congratulated the Hospitality Committee

and Toni Acton, Chair of Member Services, for a very successful fall Kick-Off Coffee. Dallas Joder is the new audiovisual (AV) staff member to assist Reston campus locations at United Christian Church and Lake Anne.

At Tallwood the back parking lot has been repaved, and the front walk has been repaired. These repairs were conducted by the Mason facilities-maintenance staff at no charge to OLLI.

In August OLLI made several outreach efforts within the local Connection Newspapers, Facebook, video ads at Cinema Arts Theatre, and a wonderful collaborative conference with AARP to recruit members.

Under new business, the Board discussed and passed four resolutions: (1) approval of \$600 from the Friends of OLLI for publication of 325 copies of *OLLI Ink*; (2) approval of an update to the Board handbook to include a description of the Travel Committee; (3) approval of guidelines to structure the development of the OLLI 2019 budget; and (4) approval of authorizing the Finance Committee to implement investments without prior Board approval, in accordance with its fiduciary responsibility to the organization.

I remember


so I worry



Obituary: Allen J. Montecino, Jr.

Allen Montecino, one of the first members of the Learning in Retirement Institute (LRI) at George Mason University, pre-cursor to OLLI-Mason, died September 17, 2018, in Odenton, Maryland. A towering figure in LRI/OLLI history, he was a member for many years and taught numerous history courses at the institute. He served on the Board of Directors, and figured prominently in *The Story of OLLI*, the history book prepared for OLLI's 25th anniversary in 2016.





The Story of OLLI). This allowed membership to increase to about 600 at Tallwood alone by 1999. In 1996 George Mason University administration recruited Allen and Ray Beery to teach classes for Mason faculty and staff on Windows 95, helping cement good relations right across the university's schools and departments. Allen loved LRI/OLLI and his many friends here.

A memorial service was held on September 25. He will be buried with military honors at Arlington National Cemetery at a later date. Further information is available at this.link.
