Washington National Cathedral Trip

Thirty OLLI members enjoyed the guided tour at the Washington National

Cathedral on November 14. It is an amazing structure with its soaring buttresses, neo-gothic architecture, stained glass windows, medieval-style gardens, and menacing gargoyles. We learned some interesting facts about the cathedral. There is no steel or iron in the structure. It is built entirely from Indiana limestone.

Inside, the oak stalls were designed by cathedral architects and carved by furniture makers. Building started in 1907 and was finished in 1990. This time line is in contrast to cathedrals that took hundreds of years to build in Europe. It is one of the largest in the world.

At the heart of the great choir sits the console for the cathedral's 1938 Skinner pipe organ composed of nearly 10,000 pipes. We were fortunate to meet the organist, who explained the complexity of this magnificent instrument. We enjoyed the piece he played. The acoustics are awe-inspiring.

Technological Advances Stimulated by the Civil War – Presented by Jim Anderson: In many ways, the Civil War (1861-1865) was the first "modern" war. It both stimulated new techniques in existing technologies and led to the creation of new technologies that would continue to be enhanced into the 21st century.

This lecture will cover some of the most obvious advances in weapons technologies (e.g., small arms, artillery, and naval weaponry), as well as warrelated techniques and technologies that were advanced by the conflict. Finally, it will address ancillary technologies such as canned foods, grain harvesters, sewing machines, and pocket watches.

Jim Anderson spent over 30 years with the CIA. He has been an OLLI instructor for the past nine years, teaching courses and leading tours focusing on American history.
