Watching TV on the Internet – Presented by Allan Hide

Today's TV's, computers, and mobile devices offer "over-the-top" options to watch movies and TV programs via streaming video over the Internet. Services such as Netflix, Hulu, YouTube, Amazon, Sling TV, and Apple TV provide new alternatives. "Cord-cutters" are replacing or supplementing their cable television subscriptions with such Internet video sources. Allan will discuss the benefits and limitations of these choices.

He assists Fairfax County residents by providing outreach and education on communications topics and cable complaint resolution.

Learn in 30: On-Board Diagnostics and Blue Drive – Presented by John Krout
Do you dread the "check engine" light on your dashboard? It covers many different failures.
Which one has caused the light to appear? Sometimes the cause is merely short term (e.g., a power surge, road-surface vibrations, cosmic rays, strong magnetic fields). How can anyone tell the difference between a persistent problem and a transient one?

On-Board Diagnostics (OBD), a mandatory standard in all cars sold in the US since 1996, includes both standard numeric codes to identify specific problems in cars and a uniform standard multi-pin connector for external devices to read those problem codes. This session will show you how to read and understand a car's problem codes using your phone or tablet and the BlueDrive hardware and software, and how to identify and ignore transient trouble codes.
