## Extraterrestrial Antony and Cleopatra Performed by OLLI Players

It is unlikely that William Shakespeare ever encountered aliens, but in Mason's Harris Theatre on August 3-4, there they were. Mason was host to a premier performance of this unique approach to *Antony and Cleopatra*, written and directed by Alex Bulova and performed by the OLLI Players. In this play, *Antony and Cleopatra in Space*, Mark Antony, as a member of the powerful interplanetary Martian triumvirate, was a resident of Mars, while Cleopatra was queen of Venus. The performance was presented as a 1930s radio play, with the seven actors playing multiple roles and adding many appropriate-to-radio sound effects. The various planets and other space travel images were represented by backdrop projections and there was even a role for a robot. Interspersed among the five acts were radio commercials, several for Shakespearean memes, such as the Ophelia
