Inside OLLI -Mason

August Storm Brings Equipment Replacement

In an August 13 thunderstorm, Â lightning struck a tree about 75 feet from TA-1. At the time, our audiovisual contractor was installing a new screen

in TA-2; power was interrupted at Tallwood and the surrounding neighborhood.

That Friday, the staff discovered a loss of internet access and telephone problems. I arrived about 10:00 to set up TA-1 for Saturday's computer club meeting. Instead, I walked through the office and cottage with Susan Todenhoft, and agreed with her diagnosis that lightning caused damage to local area network (LAN) and telephone systems. Then the fun began â€" Susan contacted OLLI's phone-system contractor, who sent a crew to investigate those issues. I called Roger Fujii, a PATACS computer-group colleague who has been helping with OLLI technology issues since 2006. Roger researched appropriate replacement LAN equipment, while I drove to Microcenter at Pan Am Plaza, buying two 24-port LAN switches that form the backbone of our network connections. I returned to Tallwood shortly after the phone crew arrived; they had to replace two instruments and swap defective cable pairs for good ones between Smallwood and the cottage. I started replacing the LAN switch in the cottage, ultimately discovering that the FiOS router had also been damaged. I substituted an older unit to get the administrative LAN restored. Roger arrived and begin untangling the office, where four pieces of LAN gear ultimately proved to have been damaged. Bill Walsh arrived mid-afternoon, and with Roger and me, found the Life-Size codecs, special-purpose computers used for video conferencing, had also been damaged and were unusable. On Saturday, OLLI finance associate Karen Nash came to work, and grabbed me as I was setting up for the computer club meeting, to check on why her computer wouldn't connect to the internet, despite the previous day's efforts. Her computer was grindingly slow, and its LAN card was damaged, needing replacement. Also, the following week Mike Emery and Tom Appich found two more damaged LAN switches in TA2. The fun continues . . .
