One of the highlights was when Martha Powers, who originally initiated the celebration six years ago, introduced special guests Chester Myslicki and Adrian Pelzner, both of whom served in World War II. With the assistance of his niece, Chester, who turned 100 years old this October, watched the program on Zoom, occasionally smiling. Adrian Pelzner offered some reminiscences from that time, while Sally Wallace, Jim Dunphy's widow, recalled Jim's love of OLLI.

The program included a presentation by Gordon Sumner, a retired Army officer and now president/CEO of Veterans Moving Forward, an organization that provides service dogs to qualified veterans. Gordon pointed out the value of service dogs to despondent veterans, often giving them something to care for and helping to reduce veteran suicides
