

A County Program to Combat Social Isolation Among Older and Disabled Adults, and a Volunteer Opportunity

On August 1, 2022, ServiceSource launched CARE (Community Access to Resources and Engagement) Mobile, a program to reduce social isolation among older adults and adults with disabilities and to improve community and social connections. ServiceSource is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to facilitate services, resources, and partnerships to support older adults and adults with disabilities, families, their caregivers, and community members, to build more inclusive communities.

CARE Mobile is a 100% mobile program based on a public-private partnership model which provides free, roving, on-site, outdoor health and wellness programming; engaging community

activities; and entertainment for older adults (age 50+) and adults with disabilities. Local community resources and consultation are also available to connect individuals to organizations for support. This program helps eliminate transportation and technological barriers by going directly to neighborhoods identified by Fairfax County's One Fairfax initiative. Areas include Mount Vernon, Springfield, Bailey's Crossroads, Annandale, Falls Church, Herndon, and Chantilly. Events are held outside when the weather permits.

Services include wellness checks such as:

- screenings for blood pressure, diabetes, vision and hearing;
- · vaccine clinics such as flu and COVID boosters;
- activities such as expressive music, dance, Tai-chi, yoga, creative arts, and crafts; and
- entertainment, such as bingo, movies, games, and karaoke.
